PLANT CARE INFORMATION

Blue Palo Verde

Parkinsonia florida

DESCRIPTION: Blue Palo Verde is a common tree found in washes around the Sonoran Desert region. It grows fairly quickly, and will eventually reach 25' tall or more, with a spread of 30-40'. The small leaves provide a shade that is light enough to grow other plants beneath. During the month of April it is covered with bright yellow flowers for 3-5 weeks. Bees are the primary pollinator, but many animals, from insects to birds, utilize the plant.

RECOMMENDED USE: It is adapted to desert landscape, but fits in to more intense gardens, but be sure to allow for its ultimate size.
